Class Description:

Develop and refine your visual perception skills ("seeing") through a series of observational drawings in pencil, charcoal and ink. The basic principles of drawing are covered including line quality, shape awareness, volume and form, light and shadow and perspective.

Class Goals and Methods:

Goals:

- Learn a variety of skills to foster proportionally correct observational drawings.
- Become familiar with basic black and white dry drawing media (graphite, charcoal, and tools).
- Become familiar with successful compositional page-placement strategies.
- Learn increasingly refined and/or appropriate levels of craftsmanship and expressive choices.

Methods:

- Weekly in-class observational drawings you can finish in-class work at home and work in your and sketchbook.
- Demonstrations, when appropriate and practice with materials and techniques, including perceptual techniques for improving accurate "seeing".
- Frequent one-on-one communication between student and teacher during work in progress.

- 18" x 24" Pad of Canson XL Recycled Sketch Paper (fold over style, 50 sheets)
- Drawing Board (masonite type, a little bigger than your large paper, 231/2" x 26" Sketch Pad Board at Blick is nice, has built in clips, handle hole and large rubber band for carrying the pads)
- Two Micron pens (.01 and .05, Sakura is a good brand)
- Kneaded Eraser
- White Mars Plastic
- Retractable white plastic stick eraser (Pentel 'Clic' is a good Brand)
- Four Graphite Drawing Pencils (1 each: 2H, HB, 2B, 6B, Staedler Lumograph or Derwent are good brands)
- Black Charcoal Pencils (1 each: Soft, Medium, Hard, Generals or Derwent are good brands)
- White Charcoal Pencil
- Conte Crayon assortment (1 each, black, white, sepia and sanguine, soft-B or 2B)
- One small box of Soft Vine Charcoal (Winsor & Newton is a good brand)
- Black soft pastels (Alphacolor 'Char-Kole" brand, box of 3)
- Metal Pencil Sharpener
- X-Acto Knife
- Glue Stick
- Roll of blue painter's tape
- Chamois
- India Ink (Winsor & Newton or Higgins are good brands)
- Bamboo Brush (Small)
- Small round brushes (for india ink work, #2, #4, #6, short handle, small white wonder brush Blick brand is nice choice, or a value pack of small round brushes)
