Required materials

- ink: any one of the following: walnut, sumi, Higgins Eternal Black, or Pelikan 4001. Also, consider bringing a small sealable container in case you need to water down some of your ink or if you'd like to try out my walnut ink, which I'm happy to share.
- * nibs (remember to buy a left-handed nib if you are left-handed):
 - one of any of the following: **Brause 3 mm** or **Mitchell 1** or **Speedball C2**
 - *and* one of any of the following: **Brause 2 mm** *or* **Speedball C3**
- * nib holder of your choice
- * **Gilbert Bond paper**, 11 x 17", one pack (50 sheets), *or* Capitol Bond
- * **pencil** for ruling lines
- * metal **T-square**, at least 24" long, the stronger the better
- * **watercolors**, in any form that you already have. If not, you can buy an 8-palette set of Prang watercolors or a tube of your favorite color.
- crummy **brush** for preparing watercolors (the one that comes with the Prang set is perfect)
- small plastic container and lid (not necessarily matching; container for holding water and lid for preparing colors)
- * writing implement and notebook for taking notes
- * paper clips, scissors, cotton rag or paper towels, eraser

Optional materials

- * metal cork-backed **ruler**, at least 24" long
- * painter's **tape** or masking tape, low stickiness
- * old toothbrush for cleaning nibs

Local vendors such as Columbia Art and Drafting have all the needed materials and may provide a student discount if you show this materials list or a proof of your class registration. Online sources include John Neal Books, www.johnnealbooks.com.
