PORTLAND PARKS & RECREATION TITLE II NOTICE

MODIFICATIONS TO POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Introduction of Reasonable Modification
PP&R will reasonably modify its policies,
practices, and procedures so people with
disabilities can access PP&R activities, facilities,
programs, and services; furthermore, PP&R
will provide reasonable modifications quickly,
easily, and without requiring proof of disability.

DEFINING REASONABLE MODIFICATION

A reasonable modification is a change or exception to policy, practice, or procedure that allows people with disabilities to have equal access to the activities, facilities, programs, and services offered by PP&R. Reasonable modifications must always be related to an existing disability.

When requesting a reasonable modification to a policy, practice, or procedure, an individual with a disability is not required to provide medical documentation or information about a diagnosis, but they must be able to explain how their disability relates to the requested modification.

GETTING HELP

Whether you call 311 or complete either of the online forms, your information will be submitted to the PP&R staff best able to assist you.

INCLEMENT WEATHER AND CLOSURES

PP&R classes, activities, rentals, and sports events may be canceled due to inclement weather, such as ice, snow, or extreme heat. Call 503-823-2533, or visit portland.gov/parks/closures for the most current information. Some recreation programs may run as conditions and staff availability allow. Safety is a major factor in determining operations at each PP&R facility. PP&R facilities, our social media outlets, and our website will all feature operating information including opening and closing times.

WITHDRAWALS AND REFUNDS

A refund or credit will be issued if notice is given before the start of the activity (unless otherwise specified). Activity withdrawals can be processed and refunded online if it is completed more than seven days before the start of the activity.

With less than seven days, please call or visit a recreation site or the Customer Service Center. Prepaid materials, supply fees, and admission tickets may not be refunded if the activity withdrawal is less than seven days from the activity start date.

Withdrawals, transfers, and refunds for swim lessons may be processed up to the third day of the class. After the third day of swim lessons, no refund will be given. Withdrawals are not processed after the last day of class. Review the activity receipt or contact the activity site for specific refund restrictions.

PHONE—Call any PP&R site. You may also phone in your registration to the PP&R Customer Service Center at 503-823-2525, Monday-Friday, 8:30am-5:00pm. Visa, MasterCard, American Express, and Discover Card accepted with phone-in registration.



IN PERSON—Any PP&R facility can process your registration, including the Customer Service Center located on the first floor of the Portland Building at 1120 SW Fifth Ave. All Community Centers are open for walk-in registration during business hours.

NON-RESIDENT PRICING

The fees listed reflect pricing for City of Portland residents. Non-residents are charged more to account for City of Portland taxes that support Portland Parks & Recreation.

IF YOU NEED ACCOMMODATIONS OR INCLUSION SERVICES:

Portland Parks & Recreation provides inclusion services for program participation. If you or someone you care for needs PP&R inclusion services, please complete the following steps:

- 1. Register for the desired program or activity.
- 2. Complete an inclusion request form at least 10 days before the start of the activity. This time will allow us to work together to secure inclusion services. The request form is online at portland. gov/parks/inclusion. For swimming support, contact the pool at which the activity takes place and ask for the Lead Instructor or Pool Manager.

ACCESS DISCOUNT

Made possible with funding from the Parks Local Option Levy (Parks Levy).

Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) believes recreation is for everyone. We know that the price of programs and activities prevents some community members from being able to participate. Thanks to the Parks Levy we can offer new payment options for people who live within the City of Portland.

City of Portland residents can register for a free Access Discount to receive reduced pricing up to 90%. The discount is valid for 12 months from the date of enrollment. No proof of income is required.

An Access Discount may be applied to:

- Admission to recreation centers and pools
- Classes, camps, swim lessons, and other registered activities
- Preschool and after school programs
- Personal training

Choose an ongoing Access Discount of 25, 50, 75, or 90% based on your financial need. Those with a lower income or higher number of family members may consider selecting a greater discount.

HOW TO USE AN ACCESS DISCOUNT

- 1. First, register for an Access Discount. Choose 25, 50, 75, or 90%, based on your financial need. You can register online, at any PP&R facility, or by calling the customer service center.
- 2. Once you have registered for an Access Discount, you may sign up for any PP&R activity or purchase an admission pass at a reduced cost. Your Access Discount will automatically apply to all eligible activities for 12 months.

For drop-in admission, mention your Access Discount for staff to look up.

WITHDRAWALS AND REFUNDS

A refund or credit will be issued if notice is given before the start of the activity (unless otherwise specified). Activity withdrawals can be processed/refunded by the customer online if it is completed more than seven (7) days before the start of the activity. With less than seven (7) days, the customer will need to call or visit a recreation site or the Customer Service Center to process the withdrawal/refund. Pre-paid materials, supply fees, and admission tickets may not be refunded if the activity withdrawal is less than seven (7) days from the activity start date. If customer needs to withdraw after the program has begun, they may request a prorated credit or refund. Withdrawals are not processed after the last day of class. Review the activity receipt or contact the activity site for specific refund restrictions.

ABOUT MULTNOMAH ARTS CENTER

Multnomah Arts Center (MAC) provides excellent arts education in the visual, performing, and literary arts at an affordable cost to students of all ages. We offer programs in music, movement, dance, theatre, woodshop, literary arts, metal arts, mixed media, printmaking, drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture, textiles, and more. These extensive class offerings are provided by over specialized teaching artists from the region. MAC serves thousands of students regardless of ability, age, race, religion, ethnic origin, sexual orientation, or financial means. Programs run year-round, and scholarships are available. Along with our vibrant arts education program, MAC presents—and partners to bring theatre, music, dance performances, gallery exhibitions, and other special events to the community; spaces are available to rent.

Founded in 1973, MAC is one of the largest comprehensive community arts education programs in the nation. A program of Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R), MAC is a model community center, sharing and maintaining space with multiple nonprofit community service providers. At the heart of MAC's success is the all-volunteer board of Multnomah Arts Center Association (MACA), a nonprofit body founded in 1983 that supports Multnomah Arts Center. While PP&R supports the annual operation and maintenance of Multnomah Arts Center, the nonprofit MACA makes it possible to exceed expectations for a community center by raising money to provide additional scholarships, outreach, community engagement, and make art studio and program improvements.

About Multnomah Arts Center (MAC) Community Engagement Program

Multnomah Arts Center (MAC) has made a strong commitment to developing a healthy, ongoing communities and outreach program, to serve centered communities, including black people, indigenous people, people of color, immigrants and refugees, people earning low incomes, people living with disabilities, older adults, and LGBTQIA+ communities. A primary focus is bringing high-quality arts education opportunities to outer east and north Portland.

Through partnership with **The Rosewood Initiative** (rosewoodinitiative.org), MAC is developing and offering satellite programming to the east Portland community, including activities in ceramics, metals, textiles, music, drawing, and painting for youth and adults. In partnership with the **Pacific Refugee Support Group** (pnwrsg.org), MAC Instructors are providing drop-in arts activities to immigrant and refugee communities where they are in their own communities. Starting in the Winter of 2025, MAC will offer Theatre Arts programming at Y.O.U.T.H (youthpdx.org).

MAC's monthly First Friday Arts for All series has been offering free drop-in arts experiences in the visual and performing arts for all ages, providing a safe space for the community to come together and create. Why? Because when asked for feedback about what we could do better, free drop-in programs at all sites have been a common request.

During the summer season, MAC partners with PP&R's Free Lunch + Play program to provide free drop-in arts activities to Portlanders through MAC's Arts in the Parks program in over twenty park locations through the deployment of mobile art studios.

While MAC has always strived to make great arts education learning available to the community, we've been able to double down our efforts through critical support from the voter approved **Parks Levy** (portland.gov/parks/parks-levy). Thanks to the **Multnomah Arts Center Association** (multnomahartscenter.org/maca), we're able to provide even more opportunities for the community through their fiscal support of all these programs, providing free materials and great equipment for the communities to learn with.

Keeping with the belief that the Arts are for All, MAC will continue efforts across the greater Portland area in 2025 and beyond.
