Materials List:

- Assortment of good quality colored pencils. Prismacolor Premier is a good choice. A set of 24 or 48 is fine for beginners. Intermediate students tend to buy extra pencils as they need them. Student quality pencils will prove disappointing.
- Good quality medium surface drawing paper pad, Strathmore 9 x 12, 400 series "Colored Pencil Pad" with 30 sheets of 100 lb. paper is good or any paper sturdy enough to withstand strong color application.
- A 9 x12 pad of tracing paper
- An inexpensive sketch pad in the same size as your drawing paper
- 2B graphite pencil or Col-Erase Terra Cotta Pencil (for layout and then erasing, they also sell a set of 12 assorted colors with Col-Erase)
- Prismacolor Premier Grey pencil (30% or 50 % cool grey is a good choice)
- Pencil sharpener that catches shavings to be used for colored pencil exclusively
- Pen style stick eraser, Factic & Tombow are good choices
- Faber-Castell kneaded eraser, soft and sticky type
- Koh-I-Nor Pencil Lengthener (Extends pencil when it gets short)
- Artist Color Wheel, Standard Version 9 ¼ inches or Pocket Version, 5-1/8 inches by The Color Wheel Company
- 2 small empty containers for holding and organizing pencils
- White artist tape
